

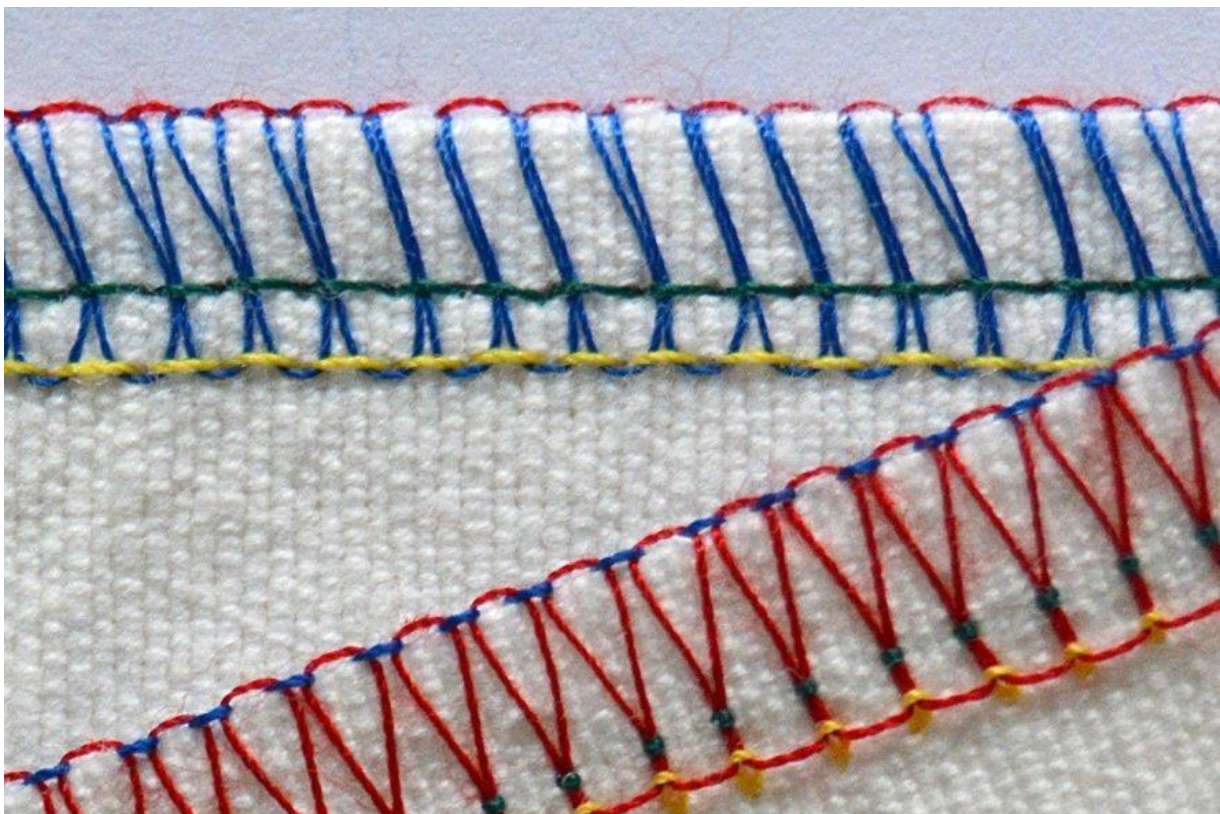
Processing Instructions for our FREILUFT and CAPRI Collections

For many of our partners, who work with our fabrics on a daily basis, this processing step is standard practice. Nevertheless, we would like to specifically point out that, for our FREILUFT and CAPRI collections, all cut edges must be finished with an overlock/serging stitch, and an additional row of stitching is required to secure the closing seams.

Especially with plain weave fabrics, cut edges may fray due to the construction of the fabric. Proper edge finishing reliably prevents fraying and at the same time provides additional stability during upholstery and confection.

The additional row of stitching ensures that the closing seams are securely fixed and increases the durability of the finished piece of furniture. This not only creates a clean and high-quality interior finish, but also ensures a long-lasting construction that meets the demands of everyday use in both indoor and outdoor environments.

With professional processing and proper care, our FREILUFT and CAPRI fabrics will retain their quality and appearance for many years to come.
